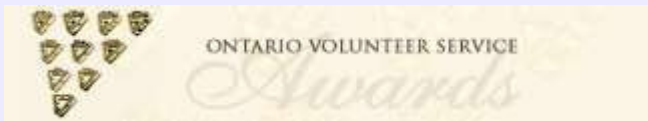

### Grey County Master Gardeners

**Name:** Forest Project

**Details:** Grey County Master Gardeners have run the Edible Forest station since the beginning of the Festival in 2011. To assist with this program, Ursula Karalus planted patches of wild leek and wild ginger in the fall of 2014. These native plantings (in Allen Park) are located by the **Edible Forest Station** and will be appreciated for years to come.



### 2016 Bruce Grey Forest Festival - Allan Park Conservation Area

**Details:** On October 4, 5 and 6 approximately 1,000 Grade 7 students visited 32 hands-on learning stations. High school students and Grey County Master Gardeners staffed the **Forest Feast** station.

While tapping a sugar maple tree is the most popular experience at the Forest Feast Station, students also learn about 13 other trees and plants that are edible or medicinal.

**Date:** Saturday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2016

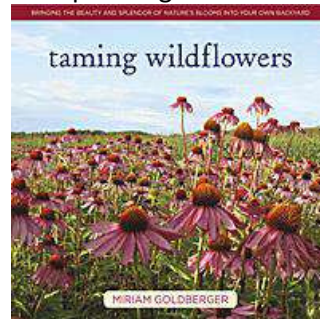
**Location:** Harmony Centre, 890 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue East, Owen Sound
