## Good News to Grow On....Funds Distributed!

Early this year, local groups were encouraged to submit a project for a share of the \$4,000 Master Gardeners of Ontario Inc. (MGOI) was providing. Eighteen groups – Durham, Etobicoke, Grey County, Guelph-Wellington, Haliburton County, Halton Region, Kitchener, Lanark, Lindsay & District, Norfolk County, Northumberland, Ottawa-Carleton, Peterborough and Area, Prince Edward County, Rideau 1000 Islands, Simcoe County, Sudbury and Toronto – all rose to the challenge and received a cheque in late March for \$222.25 each.

A wide range of interesting projects was submitted, including conservation, advice clinics, equipment purchases, projects encouraging young gardeners,

support for the Highway of Heroes, and gardens for First Nation communities. Prince Edward County requested funds for an organization that is helping First Nations in the North establish gardens to grow their own food, and challenged other groups to support the project. Guelph-Wellington and Toronto accepted the challenge, and this project will be receiving \$666.75 in financial assistance.

I look forward to checking the newsletter for group reports and photos of how their projects are developing.

## President's Corner – Advice to Grow On!

### Question

"Does an article that I write for my Horticultural Society count towards my 20 volunteer advice hours?" In the MGOI Handbook it says that "activities undertaken for another volunteer organization" do not count. I'm confused!"

### Answer

I've always considered writing articles a great way for Master Gardeners to support their local Horticultural Society. How could this not count as volunteer advice hours just because they are for another volunteer organization? And what are these activities that don't count?

I had to defer to our policy guru Kelly Noel about this one as I was confused too. The answer is in the details. The time writing an article for your Horticultural Society DOES count as volunteer hours, IF it's about gardening.

It does NOT count if you are writing about other Horticultural Society activities such as shows, photo contests and judging.

The key point is that Master Gardener volunteer advice time usually has an instructional component to do with gardening built into it. Here are some other examples of volunteer activities undertaken for another organization:

- Serving as secretary for the Horticultural Society would not count as MG admin time as it is volunteer work done for another organization even though they do not REQUIRE or report volunteer hours.
- Tending a community garden for your Horticultural Society is gardening, but it does NOT count because it lacks the instructional component.

But instructing others in how to tend a garden DOES count.

Thanks for asking that great question!

## M.G.O.I. Summer Workshop – 2017

**Details:** The Niagara Parks School of Horticulture is receiving registrations daily, and the response to this year's summer workshop is exciting. There are only 13 spots left. We are expecting that every space will be filled. There are three topics, from which two are chosen:

- Creating Gardens – A Designer's Approach
- The Carolinian Zone – Understanding A Unique Habitat
- Urban Agriculture

You will receive a parking pass, the cost of which is included in the fee. **Again this year, M.G.O.I. will subsidize each Master Gardener and Master Gardener in Training with \$50, to help offset some of the cost involved in attending.**

**Description:** If you have "Google Hangouts" on your internet device (home computer, iPad, Smartphone, etc.) and would like to co-host a live webinar to discuss your favourite gardening subject, this volunteering opportunity is perfect for you.

The Cochrane District Master Gardeners host a monthly YouTube Webinar (live and interactive) for the public. The hosts of the webinar connect via Google Hangout while the CDMG Coordinator displays a slideshow and link to a live chatroom, where the public can ask questions.
